During my practical semester, I worked in the quality management department of Pininfarina Engineering. I was supporting in the engineering quality team both on customer project activities and on centre of competence projects to increase my understanding of the processes that rule a typical automotive/industrial engineering development.

Pininfarina Engineering's core competences are product- and process engineering services. Pininfarina Engineering is part of the Pininfarina Group. They have nearly 700 employees in Italy, Germany, China and the United States. The office I worked in was in Torino.

My main project was the analysis of Jira Core aimed to an introduction as for issue tracking and project management tool in Pininfarina, including the support in the implementation of Jira Core as problem tracking tool on a first pilot project.

Apart from the content, the linguistical and cultural aspect played a major role in the personal development. Due to the circumstances, I improved my Italian significantly, adapted myself to the culture and found my way through the previously unknown work environment.
